



Hurricane KATIA

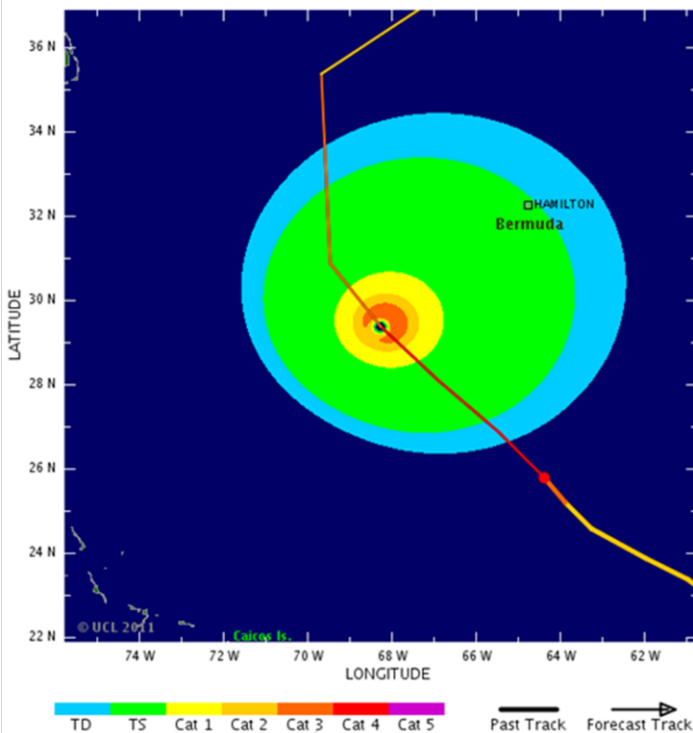
Norwegian Hull Club has been monitoring CAT 4 Hurricane KATIA that has been making her way through the Atlantic. Current forecasted path will not directly affect any known shipping hubs although Bermuda will be affected with Tropical Storm Winds as per latest forecast below (www.tropicalstormrisk.com). All forecasts are based on computers simulating over 50 000 “unknowns” so there is some degree of uncertainty illustrated with the right picture. This illustrates the possible centre of the eye of KATIA in 33 hours. Bearing in mind the that Bermuda is a Yacht hub this time of year, we would like to inform you of strong winds up to 63 kts in this area over the next days according to TSR forecast.

As always Norwegian Hull Club urges all operators of shipping in all Tropical Storm/Hurricane/Typhoon regions to apply the necessary precautions in protecting life and assets at sea.

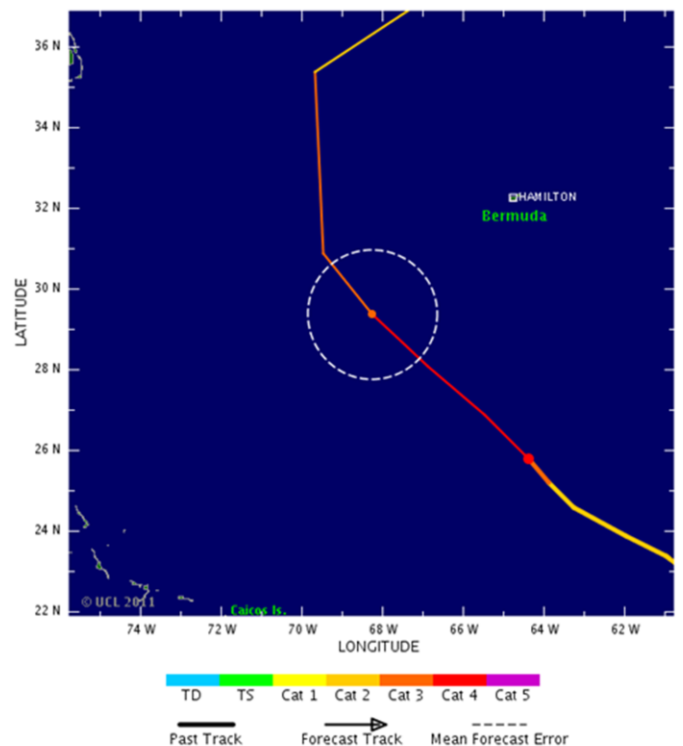
